Logbook of the World (LOTW)

- Logbook of the World (LoTW) is an online service that enables you to:
 - Electronically submit contacts (QSOs) for confirmation
 - View your submitted QSOs and resulting confirmations online
 - View your <u>DXCC</u>, <u>VUCC</u>, <u>WAS</u>, <u>WAZ</u> and <u>WPX</u> award progress online
 - Electronically submit confirmations for <u>credit</u> toward DXCC, VUCC, WAS, WAZ and WPX awards
- Getting Started
 - Download Install TQSL software
 - Request a TQSL Certificate from ARRL
 - Follow the instructions carefully and you are ready to go.
- Most Logging Programs will upload and download to LOTW easily.
